

Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees Minutes

June 11, 2018

The Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees met on Monday June 11, 2018 to transact business. Vice Chairman Bainum called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, and all joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guy Bainum and Bari Henning answered the roll call. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Gregory W. Carson, Yvonne Malott, Richard Malott, Jayne Lawrence, Ed Boll and Kevin Wiedemann.

Mr. Bainum said that Mr. Jordan was out of town for business meetings for work.

Mr. Henning motioned to approve the minutes of the last meeting. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas. Mr. Carson presented a financial report, including a comprehensive account of expenditures and receipts and the trustees accepted it.

Mr. Bainum motioned to pay the attached bills. Mr. Henning second. All yeas.

Zoning Report

Mrs. Malott presented a zoning report. Mr. Bainum thanked her for taking so many calls regarding the date for junk days. Mr. Henning said that Sheila from the village asked the trustees to attend to accept an award at 9 p.m. on Saturday at June in Olde Williamsburgh. He said that he waited until after 9:30 and it didn't happen so he walked to get food and when he walked back around 9:45, they were walking off the stage. Mrs. Malott said that the village delivered it to her since we missed it by accident since it didn't happen at 9 p.m. as scheduled. She said that Star Impressions will print our new zoning books for around \$450, whereas Office Depot quotes her almost \$900. The trustees suggested having Star Impressions print them. She said that she is planning to take the new book to the County Recorder for recording purposes. She said that they dedicated the name of the main road in South Afton Industrial Park as Afton Drive. Mr. Boll asked about her notes on the zoning report called Project Eagle. She said that the county CIC has a potential buyer for the first 46 acres. Mrs. Malott said that we have followed all of the proper procedures for the David property and she plans to call and have it mowed and we will assess their taxes.

Mrs. Lawrence said that she was asked to write up a run a month or so ago since there was a complaint against her and Tara Bice. Mr. Henning said that it was given to our medical director and he responded that things were handled appropriately and made a couple of minor suggestions, but overall, the medical director was OK with the job performance on that run.

Cemetery & Maintenance Report

Mr. Tatman turned in a report in his absence. He said that tonight is his last class so he should be back next meeting. He said that they used 14 roll off dumpsters and 1 and a half compactor trucks this past weekend. He said that he had a lot of calls on Sunday asking why they weren't open. He investigated and apparently the village of Williamsburg had the wrong dates in their newsletter which caused a lot of confusion. He said that they will be finished mowing roads this week. He said that he has 2 driveway pipes to install. He said that he has calls into paving companies to get estimates on paving costs for Hageman's Crossing Road since we had no bidders at the last meeting. Mr. Bainum said that we had major storms last Friday and a lot of trees were down and thanked the staff for cutting up all of the downed trees.

Emergency Services Report

Mr. Wiedemann gave a copy of the number of runs from last month. He said that they hit a deer last week with the ambulance on State Route 275, but there was only minor damage. He said that they implemented a new uniform policy for emergency services. He said that he has had numerous compliments from the public about the appearance and professionalism with the new uniforms. He said that NAPA had a big oil sale and he bought enough oil for him to change the oil in everything. He said that he has to take the rescue truck to Auto & Truck of Williamsburg this week to be repaired, because it only runs for about 30 seconds and shuts off.

Mr. Carson had given the trustees a copy of the proposed 2019 tax budget for filing with the county auditor. Mr. Henning motioned to approve the 2019 tax levy appropriations budget. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas.

Mr. Henning motioned to adjourn at approximately 7:35 p.m. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas.
