Williamsburg Township Trustees is sporting a new website, thanks to Township Fiscal Officer Greg Carson for designing and building the website, to include a new logo. Please take the time to become familiar with the site at <u>williamsburgtownship.org</u>. Important information, such as; roadwork and maintenance, EMS, cemetery, fire, zoning, demographics, and other useful links, are available to review.

One link of interest, at the bottom of the website, is the South Afton Park. This initiative continues to be a great point of interest, and tremendous opportunity for our township. We have observed the last harvest on the west side of South Afton Park and preparation of the site will begin this fall. Entering the link will give you the details of Clermont County's largest planned industrial site.

The 242 acres was purchased on February 1, 2016 to create a business ready commercial park. Once completed, the initiative could provide up to 1,855 meaningful permanent jobs, and support an additional 1,625 jobs. It is suggested that the payroll impact could be as much as \$186 million, according to the economic center study, which will result in a significant tax base for our Williamsburg School District. Clermont County Economic Development Director Andy Kuchta and Assistant Director Adele Evans are dedicated to making this project a success in our community. Your Williamsburg Township Trustees appreciate their progressive approach and vision. We are prepared to support them, as well as, work closely with them, to make our community one to work and live in.

Williamsburg Emergency Chief Kevin Wiedemann, and his team, have been working hard to keep our response team up to date. Recently, Dr. Thomas Charlton MD was added to Williamsburg Township, as Medical Director. Dr. Charlton has been working with the team throughout the summer to keep our emergency services top notch, to better serve our community. A special "thank you" to Ernie Ramos, Chief Assistant Prosecuting Attorney, Clermont County. Mr. Ramos guided Williamsburg Township through the process to properly contract Dr. Charlton, as our Medical Director. Mr. Ramos, who was raised in Williamsburg, continues to give back to his community. He works for Vince Farris, Clermont County Prosecutor, which supports our team for legal guidance and provides a talented service.

Chief Wiedemann has led the march to purchase a new state-of the-art ambulance. The new vehicle provides new technology to continue to provide the best services possible for our community.

Brian Tatman, Williamsburg Township Maintenance Manager, has the salt bins full and all snow removal equipment geared up, to keep us safe this winter. Please review the following snow advisory guidelines, in case a snow advisory is established.

Clermont County Snow Advisory Information Snow advisory notifications are broadcast by local television and radio stations

NOTE: We request that citizens get snow advisory information from Radio/TV broadcasts rather than calling the Sheriff's Office or Communications Center.

Under Ohio law County Sheriffs may declare "Snow Advisories" as appropriate. When the condition of roads and highways within Clermont County has become impaired as the result of snow or ice, a snow advisory may be declared and conveyed to all electronic and print media within the Greater Cincinnati area.

In Clermont County snow emergencies are used sparingly, and only when roadway conditions are treacherous throughout the entire county.

There are three levels of Snow Advisories:

Level One: "ROADWAYS ARE HAZARDOUS WITH BLOWING AND DRIFTING SNOW. ROADS ARE ALSO ICY. DRIVE VERY CAUTIOUSLY." This level of snow emergency is merely advisory in nature, cautioning motorists to drive carefully on snow covered and icy roadways. Since this states the obvious, this level will rarely be used in Clermont County.

Level Two: "ROADWAYS ARE HAZARDOUS WITH BLOWING AND DRIFTING SNOW.

ONLY THOSE INDIVIDUALS WHO FEEL IT IS NECESSARY TO DRIVE SHOULD BE OUT ON THE ROADWAYS. CONTACT YOUR EMPLOYER TO SEE IF YOU SHOULD REPORT FOR WORK." This level of snow advisory is more severe than Level One and recommends that only necessary vehicular travel be undertaken. There are NO legal restrictions or penalties for driving under a Level Two advisory. Offices and businesses have the discretion to establish "Work or NoWork" policies for their staff and employees under this level.

Level Three: "ALL ROADWAYS ARE CLOSED TO NON-EMERGENCY PERSONNEL. NO ONE SHOULD BE OUT DURING THESE CONDITIONS UNLESS IT IS ABSOLUTELY NECESSARY TO TRAVEL. ALL EMPLOYEES SHOULD CONTACT THEIR EMPLOYER TO SEE IF THEY SHOULD REPORT TO WORK. THOSE TRAVELING ON THE ROADWAYS MAY SUBJECT THEMSELVES TO ARREST." Williamsburg Township Road and Cemetery

Winter is not to far away. Which means snow and ice will be here and could cause dangerous driving conditions. Remember when they are calling for bad weather allow yourself plenty of time to get to your destination safely. The maintenance department has approximately 125 tons of salt on hand to start the winter off this year. The cost of road salt for this year is \$56.99. We use around 100 tons of salt a year. When clearing your driveway, remember not to push the snow into the roadway you could be held liable if an accident occurs.

This year the township had a road pipe relined with concrete on Hageman's Crossing Road. It was a great benefit to the township due to the fact the road was not closed for several days and the life of the pipe has been extended many years. We are still out cleaning ditches on township roads. We will work on them as the weather permits. We have also cut brush back on Musgrove Road and Cain Run Road.

The township has plenty of grave spaces available. To see what we have available please call the office to make an appointment. So far this year we have had 59 funerals. We average around 75 funerals a year. Grave spaces are \$350 for a resident of the township


