

Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees Minutes

April 27, 2009

The Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees met on Monday April 27, 2009 to transact business. Chairman Taylor called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM, and all joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guy Bainum, Bari Henning and Jim Taylor answered the roll call. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Gregory W. Carson, Deputy John Schaefer, Earl Whiteman, Brian Tatman, Richard Malott and Yvonne Malott.

Mr. Henning motioned to approve the minutes of the last meeting. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas. Mr. Carson presented a financial report, including a comprehensive account of expenditures and receipts and the trustees accepted it.

Mr. Taylor motioned to pay the attached bills. Mr. Henning second. All yeas.

Sheriff Report

Deputy Schaefer gave a copy of his schedule for May. He apologized for not making it to the last meeting, but he was in training for some new detoxifier equipment. He said that there has been some theft at Ellis Farms. He said that there is some speculation of meth trafficking in the township and they are investigating.

Cemetery & Maintenance Report

Mr. Whiteman said that they fixed the gas meter on our gas pumps. He said that the brand of pumps that we have are no longer made, so we will have to buy new pumps if something goes wrong. He said that Smith Custom Service is no longer a John Deere Dealer, so they will have to go to Georgetown to get to the nearest John Deere dealer for parts. He said that they are switching to the high intensity shirts. He said that all of the equipment is up and running. He said that he contacted Anderson Roofing about the roof repairs, but they haven't come to fix it yet. Mr. Henning asked if they needed part time help for the summer. Mr. Whiteman said that he thinks they should just pay a little overtime when needed around Memorial Day, etc. rather than hiring someone, because hiring people can be such a pain.

Zoning Report

Mrs. Malott presented a zoning report. She said that she returned the refilled ink cartridges to Office Max, because they didn't work and she had to buy new ones.

Emergency Services Report

Mr. Malott said that the EMS people are in need of pants, because they are really looking bad. He said that they are about \$35/pair and he thinks that they need 2 pair for each person and they would need about 40 pair in total. Mr. Henning motioned to buy 2 pair of pants for each EMS person at a cost of \$35/each. Mr. Taylor second. All yeas. Mr. Malott said that there is a leak on the red ambulance and Auto & Truck of Williamsburg have repaired it, but can't find the leak. Mr. Henning suggested taking it to the Ford dealer to see if they have seen a similar problem.

Mr. Bainum said that Mr. Malott is supposed to receive an award from the lodge on Friday, but he's having surgery on his knee tomorrow, so Mr. Bainum said that he would be honored to receive the award on his behalf. Mr. Bainum said that they are going to tear down the burned house on the corner of Broadway and Willow during the week of May 18.

Mr. Bainum motioned to adjourn at approximately 8:05 p.m. Mr. Taylor second. All yeas.
