

Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees Minutes

May 26, 2015

The Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees met on Monday May 26, 2015 to transact business. Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, and all joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guy Bainum, Bari Henning and Gary Jordan answered the roll call. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Gregory W. Carson, Brian Tatman, Yvonne Malott and Kevin Wiedemann.

Mr. Bainum motioned to approve the minutes of the last meeting. Mr. Henning second. All yeas. Mr. Carson presented a financial report, including a comprehensive account of expenditures and receipts and the trustees accepted it.

Mr. Henning motioned to pay the attached bills. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas.

Zoning Report

Mrs. Malott presented a zoning report. She said that she has had quite a bit of activity recently with summer building coming on, but nothing unusual.

Cemetery & Maintenance Report

Mr. Jordan thanked Mr. Tatman and his crew for making the cemetery look so good for Memorial Day. Mr. Tatman said that Ramona Edwards daughter called today and said her parents bought 8 graves in 1994 and her parents and cousins are buried there, but they want to sell the other 4 graves. She said that she and her sister are the only 2 kids and they both agree to sell them. Mr. Tatman said that the uniform prices had gone up from around \$32 to \$59 to \$68 with no explanation from Aramark. He got prices from Aramark and Cintas and Cintas is around \$35 compared to the \$68 with Aramark. The trustees agreed that the Cintas price is much better and told him to change uniforms from Aramark to Cintas. Mr. Henning said that he received an email from the County Engineer saying that the bids for Cobb Road came in around \$64,000, which is about \$8,000 under the original estimate. Mr. Henning motioned to accept the bid from Barrett Paving for Cobb Road at \$64,019.35. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas.

Emergency Services Report

Mr. Wiedemann said that they have a bunch of old equipment, but nothing of huge values that they would like to sell on www.govdeals.com. Mr. Henning said that as long as it falls under the bid requirements per ORC, then it shouldn't be a problem. Mr. Wiedemann said that he plans to take vacation July 6-10. He said that all of the radios are working now that the county has finished the conversion. He said that it's a lot nicer, because now they can talk to other departments, sheriff, state highway patrol, etc. He said that the OBWC did an evaluation of us and graded us. He said that overall we were graded very high, but needed to improve a couple of areas and they have already taken care of most of them as they were very minor. He said that he would like to send Mary Marshall and Juli Hauck to the OAEMS Conference in Columbus from July 23-26. He said that he would like to attend the Ohio Fire Chief Conference from July 16-19 and also the OAEMS conference from July 23-26 with the other members. Mr. Jordan motioned to send Chief Wiedemann to both conferences for a total cost of around \$1,235. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas. Mr. Henning motioned to send Mary Marshall and Juli Hauck to the OAEMS conference at a total cost of around \$1,152.00. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas. Mr. Wiedemann said that they are preparing for the fireworks at June in Olde Williamsburgh. Mr. Bainum said that he had some very nice compliments of the Emergency Services Department for the wreck last week. Mr. Wiedemann said that he has talked to our Medical Director about the use of Narcan and liability and he asked if he could talk to our Prosecutor about it and the trustees agreed that he could.

Mr. Carson brought a copy of Cincy Magazine to the meeting and showed that Williamsburg Schools are ranked #34 in the tristate in Education and #44 in the tristate in Safest Communities. Mr. Bainum said that the Clermont County Township Association met last week and agreed to donate most of the \$10,000 that was raised to the charities in Clermont County. Mr. Jordan said that the June in Olde Williamsburg Festival Committee thanked the township for paying for part of the port-o-lets for the festival. He said that they invited the township to participate in the parade and the trustees agreed that the EMS would be participating.

Mr. Henning motioned to adjourn at approximately 8:00 p.m. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas.
