

Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees Minutes

August 10, 2009

The Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees met on Monday August 10, 2009 to transact business. Chairman Taylor called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM, and all joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guy Bainum, Bari Henning and Jim Taylor answered the roll call. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Gregory W. Carson, Ed Boll, Yvonne Malott and Earl Whiteman.

Mr. Henning motioned to approve the minutes of the last meeting. Mr. Taylor second. Mr. Henning and Mr. Taylor – Yeas. Mr. Bainum - Abstained. Mr. Carson presented a financial report, including a comprehensive account of expenditures and receipts and the trustees accepted it.

Mr. Bainum motioned to pay the attached bills. Mr. Taylor second. All yeas.

Cemetery & Maintenance Report

Mr. Whiteman said that all of the equipment is up and running. He said that they had to put brakes on the red Ford F250. He said that they are busy with mowing as it won't quit raining. He said that they have three funerals this week, but hope to mow the roads on Thursday if there aren't any more funerals. He said that his goal is to be done before school starts. He said that the next township junk days are the first weekend in October.

Zoning Report

Mrs. Malott presented a zoning report. She said that she received a call from Mary Hanawalt to let us know that she needed help at the cemetery and Mr. Tatman was very helpful and courteous. Mr. Bainum asked about shrubbery in front of Gold Star and she said that it is on a county road and she has talked to them about it. He said that Carter Lumber has a small sign that is in the line of sight also that is a temporary sign due to the road closure, but it makes seeing traffic very difficult. She prepared notices to the property owners of 4314 North Ellis Road, 2856 Old State Route 32, 4130 West Fork Ridge Drive and 2 parcels on James E. Sauls Sr. Dr. to notify them of cutting high grass and clean up of debris. Mr. Boll said that he has heard that there is a company looking at the property along Mathis Road and State Route 32 and State Route 276. He said that they are a "green" company looking to get into residential work. He said that he would like them to contact Juwi Solar Farms to see if they would be interested to work together. Mr. Taylor said that A-1 Fabricators is moving from State Route 133 to Curliss Lane in Batavia Township.

Mr. Bainum said that he represented the trustees at the village meeting about the sewer plan upgrade. He said that it is going to be completely covered by grants and he said that the project looks very good. Mr. Henning said that he thinks part of it was already put out to bid.
