

# Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees Minutes

## September 8, 2014

The Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees met on Monday September 8, 2014 to transact business. Chairman Henning called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, and all joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guy Bainum and Bari Henning answered the roll call. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Gregory W. Carson, Yvonne Malott, Ed Boll and Brian Tatman.

Mr. Bainum motioned to approve the minutes of the last meeting. Mr. Henning second. All yeas. Mr. Carson presented a financial report, including a comprehensive account of expenditures and receipts and the trustees accepted it.

Mr. Henning motioned to pay the attached bills. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas.

Mr. Henning said that Mr. Jordan will not be here tonight due to vacation.

### Zoning Report

Mrs. Malott presented a zoning report. She said that she has sold a few permits and had a few calls to deal with over the past couple of weeks. Mr. Bainum asked about the 2 wood decorative houses at Wayne Allison's and asked if he has permits for all of the various buildings that are partially completed on his property and she said that he has had permits for all of them even though some of them were a long time ago.

### Cemetery & Maintenance Report

Mr. Tatman said that he has had about 3 or 4 calls about the International truck that is advertised for bid. He said that he left a message for the salesman at Kaffenbarger to check on the status of the new truck and he didn't return his call yet. He said that they are trimming the cemetery now and will trim at least 1 more time before the part time staff leave at the end of the summer. He said that they will be doing footers at the cemetery soon also. Mr. Henning asked him to make sure he's weed eating a little more than they currently are doing, because the mowing looks good, but he thinks that the weeds need better attention. Mr. Henning said that the salt survey didn't look good for us with SWOP4G, because we have a good supply on hand; we actually had a negative rating on the survey report. He said that the county usually gets 6,500 ton of salt and were only allocated 2,500 ton this year, so they are in trouble with salt also. Mr. Tatman said that he has a spot available if we want to stock up on grit for the winter.

Mr. Carson said that we received the acceptance of rates resolution from the county auditor. Mr. Bainum motioned to accept the amounts and rates as determined by the budget commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the county auditor. Mr. Henning second. All yeas.

Mr. Bainum motioned to adjourn at approximately 7:35 p.m. Mr. Henning second. All yeas.
