

Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees Minutes

September 9, 2019

The Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees met on Monday September 9, 2019 to transact business. Chairperson Bainum called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, and all joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guy Bainum, Bari Henning and Gary Jordan answered the roll call. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Gregory W. Carson, Kevin Wiedemann, Yvonne Malott, Richard Malott, Brian Tatman, Ed Boll and David Painter.

Mr. Henning motioned to approve the minutes of the August 26, 2019 meeting. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas. Mr. Henning motioned to approve the minutes of the August 29, 2019 meeting. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas. Mr. Carson presented a financial report, including a comprehensive account of expenditures and receipts and the trustees accepted it.

Mr. Jordan motioned to pay the attached bills. Mr. Henning second. All yeas.

Mr. Painter said that he is here to see if the county can offer any assistance to the township. Mr. Jordan thanked him for the partnership and all of the work that's been going on at South Afton. The trustees thanked him for inviting us to speak about our township at the Commissioner's meeting this week.

Emergency Services Report

Mr. Wiedemann said that the boat is being worked on at Ohio Marina. He said that the Jeep blew out it's clutch. He said that the backup life squad is being worked on at Auto & Truck of Williamsburg. He gave the trustees a copy of the runs for August.

Cemetery & Maintenance Report

Mr. Tatman presented a report that said that the roads are mowed. He said that all the roads have been patched. He said that he hasn't heard yet when they are going to do the paving project. He said that salt has been ordered. He said that the part came in for the boom mower today so they can get it back into operation to finish cutting brush back along all of the roads. He said that he has to testify before the grand jury against the person that stole the township dump truck a few weeks ago.

Zoning Report

Mr. Tatman presented a zoning report. The trustees said that they've gotten numerous complaints about the Old Eve & Earl's Market across from Alexander Lane on State Route 32. They asked Mr. Tatman to send another letter and get more firm with the owner. Mr. Bainum said that he noticed that Hartman's are putting in a new fence that she had promised. Mr. Henning said that the zoning board of appeals turned down the request for the zoning variance for events at the Old Boston Airfield. Mr. Tatman said that he received a call from their attorney George Pattison and the attorney doesn't agree with the way we are interpreting the zoning rules, so they are taking this situation to the next steps. Mr. Henning said that Old Boston Airfield is advertising for testing and tuning this Thursday night. Mr. Tatman said that he has a meeting with our county prosecutor on Wednesday.

Mr. Henning motioned to approve the RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE AMOUNTS AND RATES AS DETERMINED BY THE BUDGET COMMISSION AND AUTHORIZING THE NECESSARY TAX LEVIES AND CERTIFYING THEM TO THE COUNTY AUDITOR for the 2020 Budget. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas.
