

Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees Minutes

June 8, 2020

The Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees met on Monday June 8, 2020 to transact business. Chairperson Henning called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, and all joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guy Bainum, Bari Henning and Gary Jordan answered the roll call. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Gregory W. Carson, Kevin Wiedemann, Brian Tatman and Ed Boll.

Mr. Jordan motioned to approve the minutes of the last meeting. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas. Mr. Carson presented a financial report, including a comprehensive account of expenditures and receipts and the trustees accepted it.

Mr. Bainum motioned to pay the attached bills. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas.

Mr. Carson said that we needed to pass a resolution regarding fund being received from the CARES Act from the Federal Government. Mr. Henning motioned to pass Resolution #2-20 in regards to the CARES ACT funds. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas.

Zoning Report

Mr. Tatman presented a zoning report. Mr. Bainum said that the owners of the property next to the railroad tracks on Half Acre Road are cleaning things up. Mr. Tatman said that he had sent a letter and since they received the letter, they have been making progress. Mr. Bainum said that the neighbors call him constantly about it. Mr. Bainum asked Mr. Tatman to look at the Pitzer property's driveway on Ireton Road. Mr. Bainum said that he received complaints about the property next to WJAA because there are lots of junk cars and people are living in campers. Mr. Tatman said that there is nuisance grass on Old State Route 32 that Mrs. Malott had to send to every year.

Emergency Services Report

Mr. Wiedemann gave a copy of the # of runs for May. He said that the new life squad is in service and the 2016 broke down shortly thereafter, but has been fixed and will be back in service this week. He said that he hopes to get rid of the 2009 soon. Mr. Henning said that the weather siren on McKeever Road isn't working. Mr. Wiedemann said that he had called for service, but apparently, they haven't been there yet to fix it, so he will call to remind them. He said that he is going to check on maintenance contracts for the emergency sirens.

Cemetery & Maintenance Report

Mr. Tatman presented a report. He said that the Durapatcher is here and they did training on it today and did a section of blacktop at the emergency services building to test it. He said that they would start using it soon, but this week is junk days, so he isn't sure that they will get a lot done this week. He said that they are set up to socially distance during junk days. Mr. Jordan said that the cemetery looked very nice for Memorial Day. He said that they had storm damage on 2 large trees in the cemetery just before Memorial Day, so that took some time to clean up. Mr. Jordan suggested that we fully insure the Durapatcher Equipment on our insurance and Tate Township can fully insure it also on their insurance also and if something happens while we are using it, we will turn it in to our insurance and if something happens while Tate is using it, they can turn it in to their insurance.

Ed Boll said that he knew that the Emergency Services is trying to secure some equipment and he has some caging available and he is willing to donate it. He said that he went to the recycle bins last weekend and they were a mess. Mr. Tatman said that the county comes by about once a week and cleans up the messes. Mr. Boll said that he saw test boring being done at South Afton and asked if something was happening. Mr. Henning said that there is a potential project with code name Green Acres that has applied for a Zoning Variance and there will be a meeting in about 2 weeks, but that is all that he can say about the potential project.

The trustees agree that they feel comfortable going back to our normal 2 meetings a month.

Mr. Bainum motioned to adjourn at approximately 7:55 p.m. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas.
