

Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees Minutes

August 10, 2020

The Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees met on Monday August 10, 2020 to transact business. Chairperson Henning called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, and all joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guy Bainum, Bari Henning and Gary Jordan answered the roll call. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Gregory W. Carson, Ed Boll, Kevin Wiedemann and Brian Tatman.

Mr. Henning motioned to approve the minutes of the July 13 meeting. Mr. Jordan second. Mr. Henning & Mr. Jordan-Yeas. Mr. Bainum-Abstain. Mr. Bainum motioned to approve the minutes of the July 27 meeting. Mr. Jordan second. Mr. Bainum & Mr. Jordan-yeas. Mr. Henning-Abstain. Mr. Carson presented a financial report, including a comprehensive account of expenditures and receipts and the trustees accepted it.

Mr. Jordan motioned to pay the attached bills. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas.

Zoning Report

Mr. Tatman presented a zoning report. Mr. Bainum asked him about the property next to the YMCA that wants to be rezoned. Mr. Tatman explained that they want to put in storage units and he explained the process that is involved to change the zoning. Mr. Bainum asked about the person living in the shed and Mr. Tatman said that he's investigated it and issued a violation. Mr. Bainum said that he needs to look at the property by Duke Energy on Old 32 near the Brown County line because it's a mess still.

Emergency Services Report

Mr. Wiedemann said that we have applications from Rachel Martin as an EMT and Jacob Miller as a paramedic and he'd recommend them. Mr. Bainum motioned to hire Rachel Martin as an EMT and Jacob Miller as a paramedic with standard probationary period. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas. Mr. Wiedemann said that we received an EMS grant for \$4,100 to use on EMS stuff. He said that all hose that was manufactured before 1986 needs to be replaced per NFPA. He said that costs would be around \$22,500. Mr. Jordan motioned to replace the outdated fire hose at a cost of around \$22,500. Mr. Henning second. All yeas. Mr. Wiedemann said that we have had a total of 13 COVID cases and 8 are still active. The trustees discussed what we could spend the CARES Act money on, because we received a little over \$29K.

Cemetery & Maintenance Report

Mr. Tatman presented a report. He said that Steve Maham called and asked about a person that lives in a group home in the Village that has no family and would be considered indigent, because they are a ward of the state. He asked if the township would waive the open and close of cremation due to being indigent and the trustees agreed that this is the proper way to handle it. He said that this is Seth Howard's last week as part time cemetery worker, because he goes to college. Mr. Wiedemann told Mr. Tatman that there is a hole in the pipe on the school bus turnaround at the end of Clover Road, but it's a county road, so Mr. Tatman will check on it.

Mr. Bainum motioned to adjourn at approximately 7:45 p.m. Mr. Henning second. All yeas.
