

Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees Minutes

September 28, 2020

The Williamsburg Township Board of Trustees met on Monday September 28, 2020 to transact business. Chairperson Henning called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, and all joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Guy Bainum, Bari Henning and Gary Jordan answered the roll call. Also present were Fiscal Officer, Gregory W. Carson, Dillon Arnett, Kevin Wiedemann and Ed Boll.

Mr. Bainum motioned to approve the minutes of the last meeting. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas. Mr. Carson presented a financial report, including a comprehensive account of expenditures and receipts and the trustees accepted it.

Mr. Jordan motioned to pay the attached bills. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas.

Emergency Services Report

Mr. Wiedemann said that he received a resignation letter from Jamie Williams. Mr. Henning motioned to accept Jamie Williams resignation letter effective today. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas. He said that he has an application from Mason Mayfield as a paramedic. Mr. Henning motioned to hire Mason Mayfield as a part time paramedic with standard probationary period. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas.

Mr. Henning said that we have a zone request change from Agriculture to Industrial on 1.43 acres on parcel #52-35-08I-112 that was approved on ZC #1-20 by our zoning commission. Mr. Jordan motioned to approve the zone change from agricultural to industrial. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas. Mr. Bainum said that he talked to someone who said that the old Eve & Earl's property on Old State Route 32 in Afton that is falling down is going up for auction as a part of the estate in the near future. He said that he left a message with Mayor Lefker about finding volunteers for Halloween, but hadn't heard back yet. Mr. Henning said that Mr. Tatman left a maintenance report. He said that they are working with the Durapatcher this week to fill potholes on Musgrove Road, Henning's Mill Road and Commons of Eastfork. He said that when they finish patching, they will be rebuilding the salt barn doors. He said that the Exmark mower is at Baxla Tractor having warranty work completed. Mr. Henning said that our 2009 ambulance that has been out of service for over a year and we have spent tens of thousands of dollars on repairs and it still needs a lot of work. Mr. Wiedemann has been trying to sell it, but when people find out what is wrong with it, they walk away without purchasing it. Mr. Henning said that he talked to WJAA about donating the old ambulance to use for their haunted woods which is the largest fundraiser for that organization and a great non-profit organization that will benefit the community. Mr. Henning motioned to donate the 2009 Ford Ambulance to the non-profit WJAA organization. Mr. Bainum second. All yeas.

Mr. Carson said that we are receiving more money from the CARES Act. He said that we've already received about \$44,000 and the next round will be over \$122,000. He said that he and Mr. Wiedemann have been sitting in on seminars about how to spend the money and we are working on what we can legally spend the money on.

Mr. Bainum motioned to adjourn at approximately 7:45 p.m. Mr. Jordan second. All yeas.
