Three community leaders passed away during 2025. Allen Boothby and Jim Taylor had served Williamsburg Township as trustees and dedicated their time and skill set to the betterment of our community. Tara Bice served Williamsburg Emergency Services for over 30 years. Each of these leader's dedicated public service added value to our community and we extend our condolences, on behalf of the residents, to their families. Their dedication has made our community a tremendous place to live and a better place to raise our families. Their commitment to serve and their leadership did not go unnoticed, and we are grateful!

It's has been a challenging year for the residents to navigate around the township, county, and state roads, due to improvements this summer. This road work was needed prior to the beginning of the new school year. The bridge on Bethel Concord has been closed for much of the year for emergency repairs. Initial work on the bridge had started only to be washed out by another 100-year downpour. Jeremy Evans, Clermont County Engineer, is focused on the best type of repair and a request for more dedicated funds to properly address the issue. His main focus is to keep residents safe on the roads. This bridge will remain shut down and hopefully will be repaired by year end 2025 or in the first quarter of 2026. Earlier in the spring, we met with the Clermont County Engineers and Ohio Department of Transportation concerning the traffic at Half Acre and Sauls Drive in South Afton Park. Topics were traffic safety at Half Acre Road, James Sauls Drive and Afton Drive. Clermont County Engineers will be installing a roundabout by Purina and Design Within Reach to reduce the congestion and create a safer traffic pattern in this area.

Williamsburg Township coordinated another meeting with Adam Bird, Ohio House of Representatives 63rd District requesting support on a bridge(s) over McKeever Road and Dela Palma Road. This area continues to be a high area of accidents which has resulted in deaths and near-death accidents. More growth in the area will create significant safety challenges. The time to prepare for the construction of a bridge takes a considerable amount of planning. Williamsburg Township remains <u>persistent</u> on this issue. We are grateful that Representative Bird took the time to meet with us on this very serious matter!

Sally Drive and Coon Avenue were resurfaced this summer. The road project for 2026 will be Ashton Road and possibly full depth repair of Musgrove Road. Ongoing discussions have already taken place concerning which road(s) will be resurfaced in 2027.

We have been in the process of renewing Williamsburg Township's 20-year Land Use Plan. Drew DeMarsh, Clermont County Economic Development, is working with us to prepare an updated document reflecting our current values of area growth and land usage within the township. This comprehensive update will support our desire to maintain the <u>rural charm</u> of our community while driving economic growth on the St. Rt. 32 corridor. We are dedicated to honoring our past and shaping our future!

Prior to completing this initiative, we will need to survey the residents of the community to get their input on numerous issues which are economic in nature concerning business, rural growth, and sensitive issues, such as solar, nuclear, or other energy related matters in the Williamsburg Township area. Our intention is to get the greatest response obtainable so we can understand the values of the residents. Once this is completed, we will be able to complete the Williamsburg Township's 20-year Land Use Plan. The survey will be communicated in advance.

We are putting final touches on our Williamsburg Township Policy document and our Standard Operation Guidelines (SOG) for our Emergency Services team. We endeavor to maintain and update documents for operational guidelines and responsibilities for the trustees, fiscal officer, and all employees. As economic development continues to move through our township and other technologies, such as artificial intelligence, social media, and information technology, we want to stay at the leading edge of this change, being pro-active not reactive. All changes go through the Clermont County Prosecutors office (legal) to be reviewed and legally acceptable.

Fiscal Officer Doug Lefferson and trustees attended the Clermont County Tax Incentive Review Council (TIRC). All Enterprise Zones, Tax Increment Financing, and Community Reinvestments were approved. The intent of this meeting is to review these agreements with area businesses and review compliance with the understanding of agreements.

Williamsburg Township is patrolled by the Clermont County Sheriff's Office. When available, the Sheriff's office reviews the offense report in our stated public meetings with the Trustees. The report is a very comprehensive account of the activity within the township and a monthly running record of activities. We appreciate and value the daily commitment this team provides, keeping our community safe.

On August 21, 2025, Design Within Reach kicked off their groundbreaking of a 112,320 square foot expansion at their 617,760 square foot facility. We appreciate their commitment to growth and their boldness to embrace the fact that they are proud to be in Williamsburg Township!

We have been working with Desmond Maaytah, Executive Director, Clermont County Land Reutilization Corporation to demolish structures that are unsafe in Williamsburg Township. Many times, these funds pay for the complete demolition of the dilapidated structure. If you have a building that fits this description and desire to have the structure removed, please call the township so we may work with you to access this opportunity. The process can be lengthy as Mr. Maaytah acquires funds for the projects. Currently, there are two dwellings that are on the schedule to be removed.

Judy Raub of the Kiwanis Club of East Fork Region recently attended a Williamsburg Township meeting and presented information on what this team does to improve our community and make meaningful change. Kiwanis is dedicated to improving the world one child at a time. They also honor those who serve by presenting the "Fields of Honor". Erica Pursley of the Clermont County Mental Health Board made a presentation at a recent meeting bringing attention to their levy to support mental health and recovery. This service supports over 25,000 Clermont County residents each year. In 2024, 7,088 youth received behavior support services – up 18% since 2022. This program supports mental health, substance use treatment, prevention, recovery, harm prevention, suicide prevention, and many more matters. It will be ready for this winter's weather. This past summer the township paved Sally Drive and Coon Avenue.





Some Harmony Hill work of







Our area's only America-250 barn, located on McKeever Road, and visible from State Route 32, is owned by Lucy and Charles Snell. It is one of only five barns selected in the State of Ohio as an official America-250 barn. The painting on it depicts the Leavitt Thaxter Pease home in Williamsburg, New Leavitt Thaxter Pease home in Williamsburg, New Richmond's Cranston Presbyterian Church and the Ohio River, and is representative of Underground Railroad activity in Clermont County - which has forty-two sites on its Freedom Trail, with 22 being on the National URR - more than in any other county in the state. Williamsburg has five of those sites, and Ohio has more URR sites than any other state. The dedication took place on a beautiful afternoon on August 27, 2025. Many area citizens, historical society representatives, Clermont County Convention and Visitors' Bureau staff, County Commissioners, Mayor Weaver and other dignitaries were present for the dedication. dedication.

A tremendous Thank You to the Snell family for all they did to prepare the barn for this distinct honor. This same barn also served as Ohio's Bicentennial Barn. The artist who painted the barn both times is Scott Hagan, "the Barn Artist." That nickname was given to him by the Ohio Bicentennial Commission. He painted all eighty-eight county barns for Ohio's Bicentennial Celebrations.

If you haven't visited Harmony Hill we encourage you to do so. It is so rewarding to be able to share information about Williamsburg History with museum visitors; sometimes they even learn about their ancestors or hear about former owners of their homes. The Clermont County Historical Society is open to visitors on the same first Saturday of the month that Harmony Hill is open (1-4).


